
GENERAL MANAGER'S STATEMENT

MESSAGE FROM THE LORD MAYOR


The City of Melbourne comes alive in September when the Melbourne Fringe Festival can be seen in the streets, theatres, laneways and parks of our city.

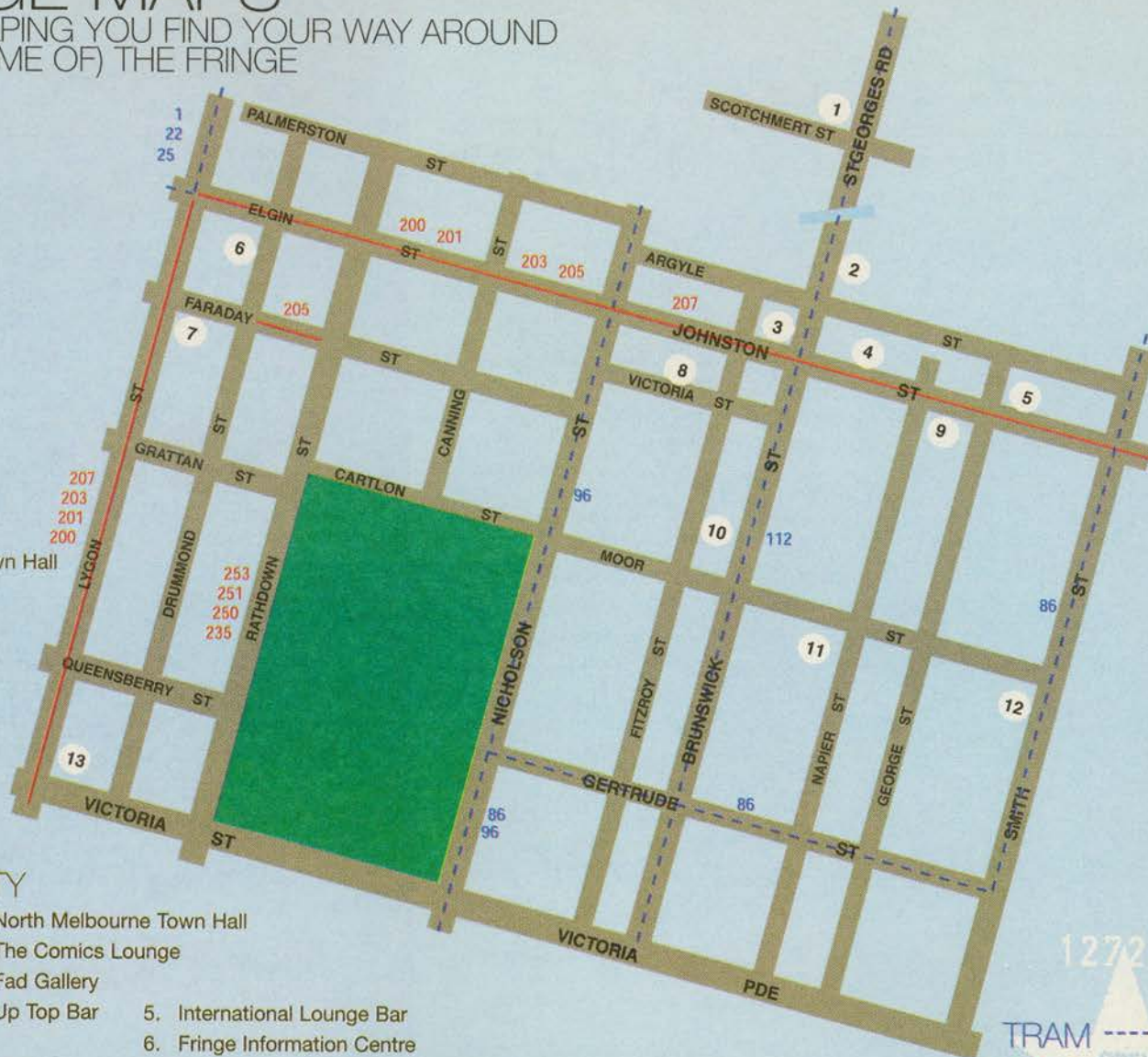

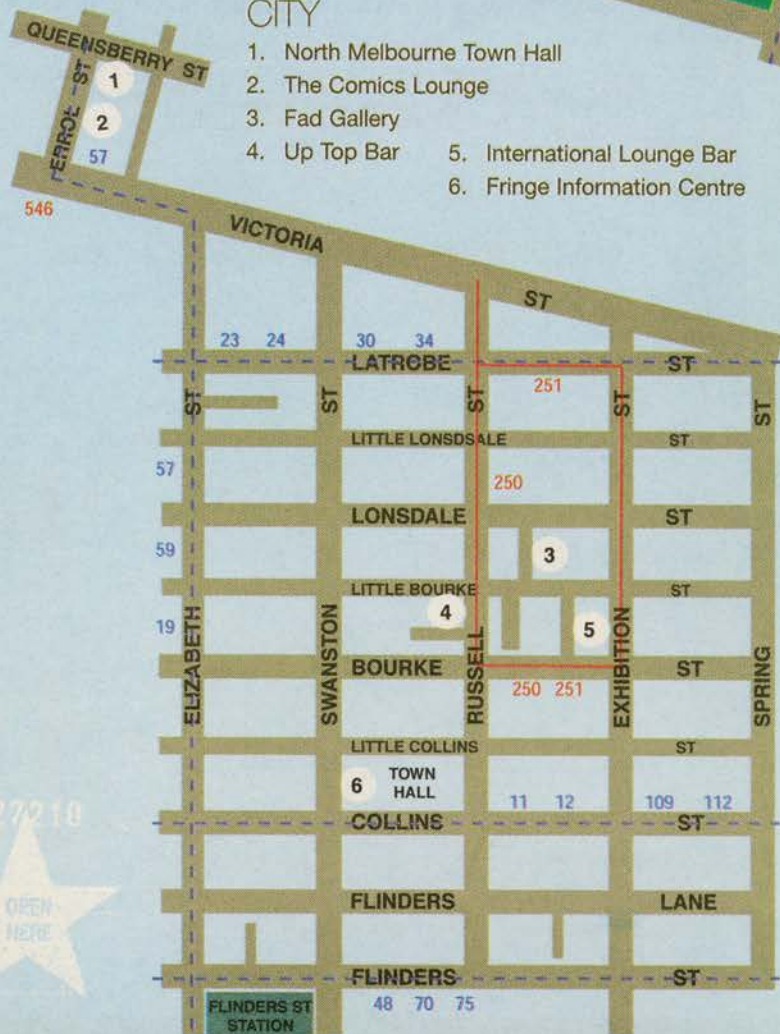

HEARTBEATS (3) A Play In Three Acts

Can you remember a time - a frozen moment - when all you can hear is the beating of your own heart? Meet five people - trapped in a prison of their own creation ... Simon Morrison's debut play is a punchy yet fresh exploration of love, missed opportunities and loneliness.
